EDSA Revolution Anniversary

Eid al-Adha

This holiday pays tribute to all Filipino heroes. It is set every last Monday of August to coincide with the anniversary of the Cry of Pugad Lawin, the beginning of the Philippine revolution against the Spaniards.

This holiday honors the courage of Filipino and American soldiers during World War II. It is celebrated on the same day as the Fall of Bataan and the start of the Bataan Death March on April 9, 1942.

This holiday celebrates the EDSA People Power Revolution, a nonviolent revolution lasting from the 22nd to the 25th of February 1986 that toppled the Marcos dictatorship and restored democracy in the Philippines.

On this holiday, Muslims honor the willingness of Ibrahim (Abraham) to sacrifice his son Ismael in obedience to Allah (God), who then provided Ibrahim a lamb to sacrifice in Ismael's place.

On this holiday, Chinese all over the world celebrate the beginning of a new year on the traditional Chinese calendar. It is also called the Lunar New Year or the Spring Festival.

On this holiday, Christians remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus at Calvary. It is part of the Paschal Triduum (three days) before the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday.
